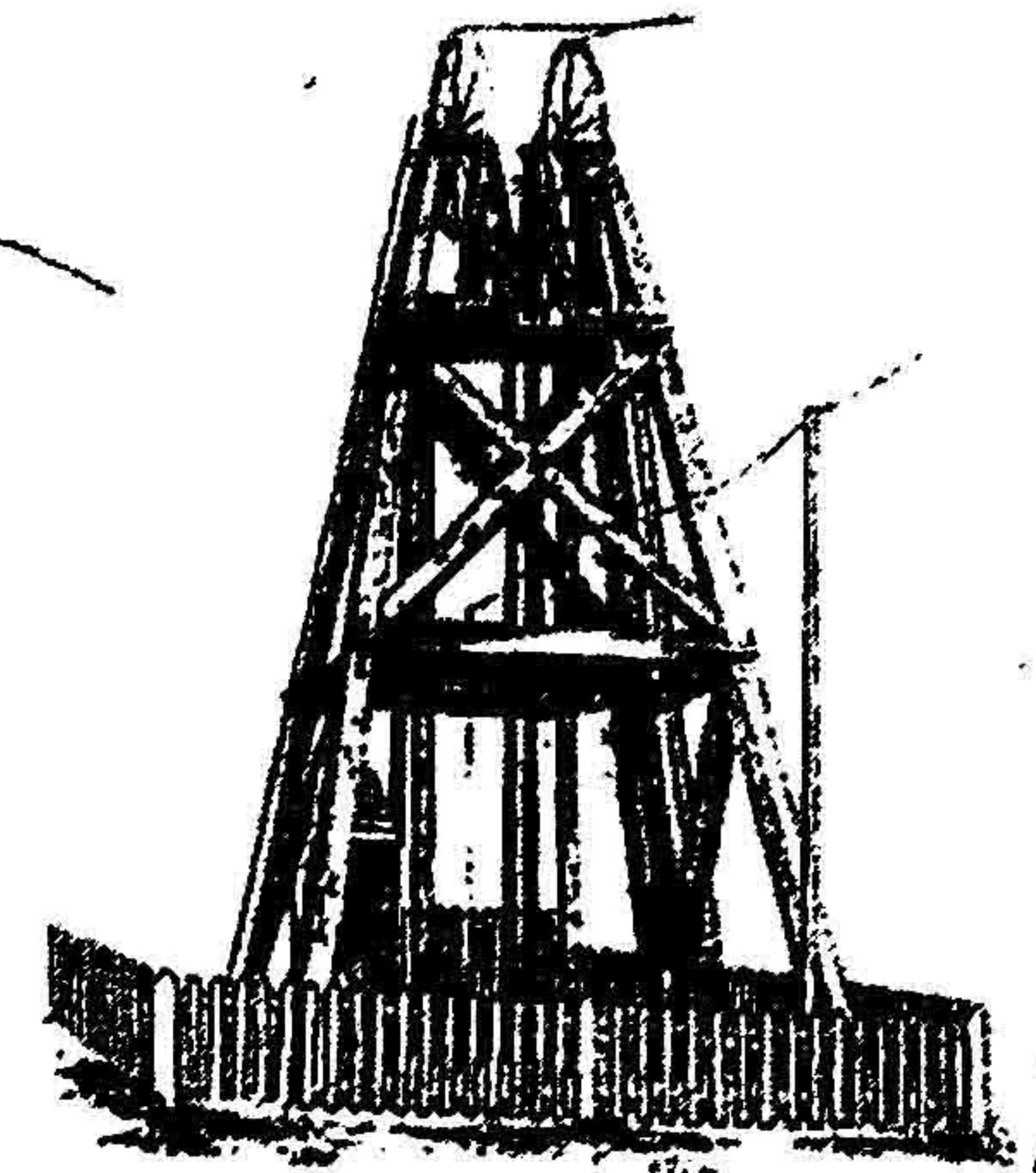



SNAILBEACH MINE
